¹⁸ do not be arrogant toward the branches. If you are, remember it is not you who support the root, but the root that supports you.

¹⁹ Then you will say,

[&]quot;Branches were broken off so that I might be grafted in."

²⁰ That is true. They were broken off because of their unbelief, but you stand fast through faith. So do not become proud, but fear.

²¹ For if God did not spare the natural branches, neither will he spare [us].

²² Note then the kindness and the severity of God: severity toward those who have fallen, but God's kindness to you, provided you continue in his kindness.

²³ And even they, if they do not continue in their unbelief, will be grafted in, for God has the power to graft them in again.

²⁴ For if [we] were cut from what is by nature a wild olive tree, and grafted, contrary to nature, into a cultivated olive tree, how much more will these, the natural branches, be grafted back into their own olive tree.

⁸ For I tell you that Christ became a servant to the circumcised to show God's truthfulness, in order to confirm the promises given to the patriarchs,

⁹ and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy.

¹⁰ And again it is said, "Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people."

¹¹ And again, "Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and let all the peoples extol him."

¹² And again Isaiah says, "The root of Jesse will come, even he who arises to rule the Gentiles; in him will the Gentiles hope."

¹³ May the God of hope fill [us] with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit [we] may abound in hope.

Proposition: There is a common bond between believers of all time.

Main Point 1: Ritual is important, but cannot save.

Point 1: Baptism does not save.

- 1. Cloud. (v. 1b)
- 2. Sea. (v. 1c)
- 3. Moses. (v. 2)

Point 2: The Lord's Supper does not save.

- 1. Spiritual food. (v. 3)
- 2. Spiritual drink. (v. 4a)
- 3. The Rock. (v. 4b)

Main Point 2: Heartless ritual only brings death. (v. 5)

Main Point 3: Only a true faith in the Rock can save. (v. 4c)
