Our Acknowledgement of Temptation

Westminster Larger Catechism, Question 78

Whence arises the imperfection of sanctification in believers?

The imperfection of sanctification in believers arises from the remnants of sin abiding in every part of them, and the perpetual lustings of the flesh against the spirit; whereby they are often foiled with temptations, and fall into many sins, are hindered in all their spiritual services, and their best works are imperfect and defiled in the sight of God.

Confession of Sin (Responsive)

James 1:12-15

For when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life,

Which God has promised to those who love him.

<sup>13</sup> Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God,"

For God cannot be tempted with evil, and he himself tempts no one.

And sin when it is fully grown brings forth death.

Individual Confession of Sin

The High Priestly Intercession of Christ (Responsive)

Hebrews 2:18; 4:15-16

For because he himself has suffered when tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.

The Certainty of Our Perseverance

Westminster Larger Catechism, Question 79

May not true believers, by reason of their imperfections, and the many temptations and sins they are overtaken with, fall away from the state of grace?

True believers, by reason of the unchangeable love of God, and his decree and covenant to give them perseverance, their inseparable union with Christ, his continual intercession for them, and the Spirit and seed of God abiding in them, can neither totally nor finally fall away from the state of grace, but are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>14</sup> But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire.

Let us love and sing and wonder, let us praise the Savior's name! He has hushed the law's loud thunder, he has quenched Mount Sinai's flame: He has washed us with his blood, he has brought us nigh to God.

Let us love the Lord who brought us, pitied us when enemies, Called us by his grace, and taught us, gave us ears and gave us eyes: He has washed us with his blood, he presents our souls to God.

Let us sing, though fierce temptation threaten hard to bear us down! For the Lord, our strong salvation, holds in view the conqu'ror's crown: He who washed us with his blood soon will bring us home to God.

Let us wonder, grace and justice join and point to mercy's store; When through grace in Christ our trust is, justice smiles and asks no more: He who washed us with his blood has secured our way to God.

Let us praise, and join the chorus of the saints enthroned on high; Here they trusted him before us, now their praises fill the sky: "You have washed us with your blood; you are worthy Lamb of God!"

Text: 1 Corinthians 10:12-13

Sermon Title: "Lead us not into temptation"

Delivered By: Pastor John Ceselsky

Proposition: We must not give into the temptation to sin.

Main Point 1: Temptations common nature. (v. 13a)

Point 1: We are not alone.

Point 2: Jesus. (Hebrews 4:15-16; 2:18)

Main Point 2: Stand up under temptation. (v. 12)

Point 1: Those who think they stand.

Point 2: Those who will fall.

Point 3: What about when a believer gives in to temptation?

Main Point 3: God is faithful (to us) in our temptation. (v. 13b)

Point 1: Limits the temptation.

Point 2: Strengthens us in temptation.

A. Provides a means of escape.

B. Provides the means to endure.
